Celebrating 75 years of Hometown Credit Union

The idea of organizing a credit union in Kulm began at a meeting of the German Northwest Farmers Union local. After corresponding with credit union officials in Jamestown, ND, a series of meetings were held and it was decided to apply for a charter to organize a credit union in Kulm. The charter for the Kulm Credit Union was granted on December 10, 1949 and on March 23, 1950 a meeting was called to elect officers for the board of directors. After being in business for one year, the credit union grew to 129 members.

A major milestone occurred in October 1974, when the credit union reached \$1 million in assets. Other notable events include approving a merger with the Ellendale Credit Union in 1978; opening a branch office in Ashley on May 4, 1987; and changing the name of the Kulm Credit Union to Hometown Credit Union in 1988. in 1995, the Hazelton Credit Union merged with Hometown Credit Union. Presently, Hometown Credit Union's field of membership is a 75 mile radius from Kulm, and a 50 mile radius from Hazelton. Additional branches were opened in Lincoln in 2017, and Medina in 2021. The credit union currently serves 3,353 members, and has \$200 million in assets.

Throughout the years, the credit union operated out of various locations in Kulm. in 1972, the credit union purchased a building from Joe Melicher. The credit union occupied this facility until 2010, when construction began on a new facility on the site formerly occupied by the Kulm City Hall. The credit union moved into the new office March 5th, 2011. In 2015-2016, a new facility was constructed in Ashley.
